Fuel is always at a shortage right before and following a hurricane and price gouging is common. Be prepared to fill up fast. Batteries are the fastest item to fly off the shelves, sometimes within hours of a hurricane warning. Power may be out for days following a storm. Get a quality waterproof flashlight now. When the cable and power go out, battery operated radios are the only way to know when the storm has passed. If you can afford a generator, get it now! Price gouging is common pre-storm. Get a good quality cooler now to keep your food and water when power goes out.
